<p>Play the pattern train game on Topmarks Maths games. Begin on level 1 and move onto level 2 when confident. Google Pattern Train Game and it comes up.</p>  <p>Read and colour the real and nonsense words. Choose one colour for the real words and a second colour for the nonsense words. Once you have decoded each word decide if it is real and you could use it in a sentence or if it is nonsense.</p>	<p>Play a memory game. Find 6 things around the house to place on a tray. Cover the tray with a cloth and then ask someone to remove an object while you look away. What has been taken away? Can you describe what it looked like? To extend the activity make it up to 10 objects.</p> <p>Read the sentences about the beetle and answer the questions. <i>(Children may need support with some of the words, which is fine. It is about understanding what they have read and retrieving information from the text)</i></p>	<p>Can you compare the size or weight of 2 different household objects? Can you use the vocabulary lighter, heavier, bigger, smaller, longer shorter. To extend the activity compare 3 or 4 objects and record your findings in your work book.</p> <p>Have fun splashing in some water, maybe in your bath or just in a bowl. But while your playing can you find things that float and sink? Talk to a family member about why you think they float/sink. Record your findings in pictures or words on the Float or Sink?</p>	<p>Layout number cards 1 to 20 in order. Then while you close your eyes ask a family member to swap two numbers, e.g. the 4 and the 14. Then count along the line saying when you reach a number in the wrong place. Then keep counting until they reach another mis-placed number. Which 2 numbers have been swapped? Repeat this several times. Use a stopwatch to see how quickly you can find the mis-placed numbers?</p> <p>Teach your Monster to Read. Log in and help your monster to learn his new sounds and find the Trickies.</p>	<p>As we are all loving the sunny weather I am challenging you to write a Spring Poem on the writing frame in the resources pack. Think about using all of your senses to describe the world around you. Use the word bank at the bottom of the page and your phonics sounds mat to support you.</p> <p>Spend some time trying to earn some points on Mathletics or Numbots. Can you challenge yourself to earn more coins, points or stars than last time?</p>
