Play a make-believe journey game with your child. Make a vehicle out of a cardboard box that you decorate together, or just grab some cushions, pile in a few teddy bear passengers, and let your child drive you off on an adventure. Upload to Tapestry if you can.	Chatting with your child whilst getting ready for the day encourages them to form longer and more descriptive sentences. You could ask them to talk through the order of which clothes they are putting on, asking questions like, “What are you putting on first? What’s next? Where should your socks go?” Only upload photos of outer garments – no underwear please!	Help your child make a puppet show about their favourite story using objects around the house. Take a photo and upload to Tapestry if you can.	Play catch with a twist. Using different words when taking turns to catch and throw the ball is a really fun way to develop your child’s language. You could use words from different themes each time. For instance, you can ask your child to name different animals, colours, food etc. Take a photo and upload to Tapestry if you can.	Make some ice – fill margarine tubs, ice-cube trays or balloons with your child. Where do they go? Investigate freezing and melting. What if you add salt? Extend their science vocabulary: freeze/melt, hot/cold, predict, why? Upload to Tapestry if you can. Talking videos where they explain outcomes would be great!

Collect 5 different items, for example, teddies, cars, Lego and such. Order them in length from longest to shortest. Use long/short/medium.	Sing all the nursery rhymes you know. Ask your child to throw a dice and count the spots. Can your child find the correct numeral on the grid?	Use a bag to collect 10 different items, for example, leaves, twigs, grass, daisies etc. Get your child to do the counting. Can you make a picture or build something with these items.	Use sticks, leaves or stones to make all the letters in your name. Take a photo, please.

Treasure Map – Make a map of your garden or outside space. Can you plot all the things you can see onto your map? For example, trees, flowers, paths, sheds, garden toys etc. Now hide some ‘treasure’ and plot it onto your map. Give your map to a family member to see if he or she can find out what you have hidden.
