<p>Spot the difference activity. Look closely at the 2 pictures. Find the 8 differences and talk about them with someone at home. Make sure you are sharing your ideas in full sentences. Make a list of the 8 differences you have found.</p> <p>Use counters, Lego blocks or any physical resources you can find to support you with your colouring addition to 20 sheet. Add the two numbers together to find the total and that will tell you which colour to fill in each section. You will have a beautiful picture when you finish.</p>	<p>Reading Comprehension Ask the children to try to read as much of the text independently as they can. Then encourage them to read it again. Once they have read the questions underline the answers in the text to help them write their answers.</p> <p>Write a set of number cards from 1 to 10. Mix them up and without looking pick 2 cards. Using resources from around your home, if you need to, add the two numbers together. Can you record some of your number sums in your home learning book using pictures or writing the numbers?</p>	<p>Read your favourite story with someone at home. Then collect some of your toys and act out the story with them. Think about the different characters in the story and the main events that are needed to make the story make sense. You could perform the ‘play’ for everyone at home.</p> <p><i>Complete challenges in Mathletics to earn 200 points.</i></p> <p>Practice saying numbers 1 – 20 forwards and backwards. When you are confident saying your numbers to 20 ask someone to say a number e.g. 6 and then count on from that number to 20. Repeat with different numbers.</p>	<p>Play Phonics Pop You can select a set of letters (on the left) or 3 individual letters (on the right) that you need to practice. Then press GO and get popping the correct letter bubbles. Don’t forget to get the alien spaceships to earn more stars.</p> <p>Play the dice addition 4 in a row game. Can you find four numbers in a row by rolling the two dice and adding the numbers together to find the total and placing a counter, car, Lego block or coin on the answer?</p>	<p>Phase 3 phonics missing word activity. Use your phonics knowledge to write the words for each of the different objects in the under the sea picture. You will need to use your best handwriting to fit your writing in.</p> <p>Complete the one more and one less challenges. Ask someone at home to read the challenges and then when you have completed the challenge you can explain what you have found.</p>
