This term we will continue to develop positive attitudes towards and stamina for writing by:

- Diary Writing – related to George's Marvellous Medicine
- Reading and writing stories from the same author (focusing on the 'The Twits' by Roald Dahl)
- Exploring the differences between fiction and non-fiction texts
- writing non-chronological reports (linked to our class topic 'Discovering Africa')

Science

We will begin to learn about different ways to keep themselves healthy. We will consider the importance of eating a range of different types of food. We will also start to learn about the importance of exercise and hygiene.

We work scientifically by identifying and classifying food, using tables, and Venn and Carroll diagrams. We will also make observations and collect data while carrying out exercises, and use their observations and ideas to suggest answers to questions.

Geography

Discovering Africa 'Shall we go on a Safari?'

During this topic we will be recapping the name of the world's 7 continents and 5 oceans. We will be locating the continents on world map and globe. We will then look more closely at Africa with a focus on finding out what it would be like to live there (focusing on wildlife, landscape, culture, art, tribes etc). We will then be making a comparison with where we live.

Maths

This term we will focus on measures including

- Fractions
- Telling the time
- Length
- Volume and capacity
- Weight
- Temperature

Children will choose and use appropriate standard units to estimate and measure using rulers, scales, thermometers and measuring vessels.

We will compare and order lengths, mass, volume/capacity and record the results using $>$, $<$ and $=$

We will complete practical activities using measuring apparatus and engage in problem solving tasks.
