# **Attendance**

At Whinmoor St Paul's, we believe that high levels of attendance and a punctual start to the school day are important for all children. Promoting excellent attendance is the responsibility of the whole school community: staff, pupils, parents, carers and governors. All children should be at school, on time, every day the school is open, unless the reason for the absence is unavoidable. Occasionally your child may be reluctant to attend school, we encourage families to discuss any concerns they have with the class teacher in the first instance. Staff are always happy to meet with you to talk through any concerns or questions you may have in regards to attendance.

### Reminder - Weather:

As we move into the spring term, we will always endeavour to keep our school open. However, if we have a serious snowfall overnight and are not able to open, we will inform families as soon as possible by sending a text, sending a tweet and uploading information onto the school's website. We will also inform local radio stations. In line with government guidelines, we ask that home learning takes place, should we need to close school. Work is uploaded each week onto the website, under class pages. Alongside this, we ask that children read during the day. We also ask that children take part in a snow activity which families feel is age appropriate, from drawing a picture of a snowy day through to building a snowman and taking a photo to share with us on Twitter. Whatever families feel is appropriate. Most of our children love the snow and it is wonderful to see them having fun! For the vast majority of snowy days, school will be open, so please remember that if children wear wellington or winter boots to school, they will need a change of shoes for the day. Either their black school shoes or pumps. If you can send a peg (labelled with your child's name) to keep the wellies together, we would be grateful.
