Sound

This term, the children are exploring how all the "stuff" around us is made of matter — anything that has mass and takes up space. They will focus on the three everyday states of matter: solid, liquid, and gas. Learning this topic gives children a solid (no pun intended!) scientific foundation: they begin to understand the material world, how things behave, and how energy and temperature affect materials. It also builds their scientific language and observational skills.

This term we will be continuing to explore ancient Egypt, with a focus on the river Nile that runs through Egypt.

We will still be looking at the story called 'The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane.' This is a fantastic story all about a china rabbit living on Egypt Street.

Maths

This term Year 4 will be learning about:

- Multiplication and Division
- Area.

Year 4 will practise their times tables daily, ready for the government times table check later in the year.

This half term's KIRF is the **9 and 11 times tables**. Children will be tested three times during the half term to ensure progress.
