Science

This term the children will be learn about keeping healthy – exercise, healthy diet and keeping clean. We will then move onto a topic on materials. We will be naming and sorting a range of materials and conducting experiments to identify the properties of materials.

During our science lessons, we will also be covering our sustainability topic to look at plastic and the harm it can cause.

Maths

Addition and Subtraction

During this topic, we will carry on developing our calculation skills taught in Year 1 to add and subtract numbers to 100. We will use a variety of methods such as number lines to support our calculations.

Shapes

During our Shapes topic, we will be able to recognise 2D and 3D shapes. We will learn all about counting sides, faces and vertices, as well as making patterns, sorting, and drawing the shapes.

KIRFS

For our KIRFS this term we will be practising counting, reading and writing numbers to 100 in numerals.



Geography

In geography, we will become intercontinental explorers!

We will learn the names of the seven continents and 5 oceans as well as delving deeper into the geography and culture of some countries within the different continents.

Within this work, the children will also learn about the climate, physical and human geography of each of the continents.

Computing

Information around us – questioning

In this topic the children learnt to create simple databases and then create graphs and pictograms to represent the information they have collected. They then get to ask and find the answers to their questions about the data.

Music

In music lessons, we continue with our topic for the term called 'Time to Play'. In this half term, the children will build on what they already know and use this to create and combine rhythmic patterns within a performance and represent rhythmic patterns using basic musical notation.

PE

During P.E this term we will begin to develop our balance and agility.

We will be having a focus on behaviour traits we need to be a good sports person and using our Commando Joes behaviour for learning points to help us!
