



Spring One in Year 6


English

Science

This term we will be studying light in more detail. We will identify parts of the human eye and discuss their functions. We will explore how objects omit light or reflect light, and how light travels. We will then use this knowledge to produce shadows and plan an experiment to see what factors change the shape and size of shadows.

Maths

This term, we will be very busy building on our learning from previous years looking at place value; methods for the four operations of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division; calculations involving fractions and area and perimeter.

New topics include:

- Ratio and Proportion
- Algebra
- Converting units of measure

We will also extend our knowledge of the Properties of Shape



History

The Romans

What made the Romans so powerful?

We will discover and use facts about Roman Gods and listen to the myth of Romulus and Remus. We will learn about Julius Caesar's attempted invasion in 55-54BC and the successful invasions by Claudius and conquest. We will look at the events of 'Boudicca's Rebellion' from different perspectives.

Art

This half term, Charles Dickens will be exploring identity through artwork. The aim is to enable children to explore how artists embrace aspects of their experience of life – using their background, culture, race, gender, and interests to inform and shape their artwork.

Computing

This half term, pupils will learn about digital literacy- with a focus on blogging. This unit will give children a basic understanding of how to plan, create and present their own blog.

Music

The term's music lessons begin with an opportunity to get creative with vocal and instrumental sounds. The children will develop improvisation skills, learning how to make subtle changes to vocal timbre as well as exploring dynamics, pitch, tempo and articulation to achieve effects.

PE

Our PE days this term will be and Tuesday and Thursday.

Our focus for PE this half term will be symmetry, balance and travel and handball.

This half term we will be exploring the importance of Pilgrimage within different religions. We will explore the significance of pilgrimage in various religions, focusing on the beliefs and stories behind key sites, such as the ummah in Islam and devotion to Mary in Catholicism. It examines how pilgrimage impacts individuals spiritually and how it shapes their lives. Students reflect on the value of pilgrimage today, considering themes like reflection, repentance, and remembrance. By comparing different practices, they evaluate pilgrimage's relevance in the modern world and its lessons for personal growth.
