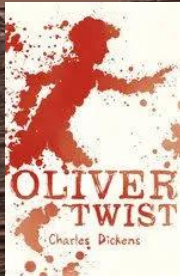
This half term we

Science

Fossils

This half term we will be looking at the discoveries of Mary Anning and how they impacted science as we know it today. Children will be introduced to the enquiry question: "How have fossils changed over time, and what evidence do they provide for evolution?" This research-based investigation encourages students to explore how fossils from various historical periods have formed and how these

Maths

This half term, we will be looking at real life mathematics and completing challenges that get us to use all the knowledge that we have learnt this year to help solve problems such as budgeting, planning a party and lots more.

In addition to this, we will introduce the children to some high school mathematics in particular looking at how to read their school and bus timetables accurately.



History



We will continue to work on our history topic for this half term where we will be studying the Victorians with our focus on the Industrial Revolution.

We will consider the role that it played in creating our society as we know it today.

In addition to this we will then discover how Fair Trade impacts the world. We will be looking at where food comes from and how Fair Trade works and supports farmers and families all around the world with a focus on the impact it makes on food trade and the environment.

We will have two topic – they will be athletics and Commando Joes and will hopefully allow us to complete our session outside in the sun! Children are allowed to come to school on these days dressed in their PE kits. This must be in line with our PE kit uniform.

Computing

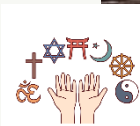
We will continue to be using the Purple Mash scheme of work – a new scheme of work that we have introduced this half term. Our focus topic will be 'Coding' and 'Networks.'

R.E

In our RE this half term we will be focusing on how worship impacts religion and daily lives.

During the term, children will be able to develop an understanding of how religion can support us through difficult times. We will identify beliefs about life after death in at least two religious traditions, comparing and explaining for similarities and differences.

With this we will then be able to make clear connections between what people believe about God and how they respond to challenges in life.
